



Sunday, May 12, 2024 Never Alone



Today's readings: Acts 1:1–11; Psalm 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9 (6); Ephesians 1:17–23 or Ephesians 4:1–3 or 4:1–7, 11–13; Mark 16:15–20. On Jesus' final day on earth, the disciples might be expected to be sad. They also might be confused about what will occur. Jesus did not attempt to clear their confusion; his intent was to set them on their mission. To the disciples' concern over whether Jesus would restore the kingdom of Israel, he replies, "It is not for you to know. . . . You will be my witnesses . . . to the ends of the earth." Still, they needed to be stirred to action by the angels who asks, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

The Gospel depicts the disciples as being more confident. After hearing that they are to "go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel," the disciples went forth and preached everywhere." In the reading from Ephesians, we hear that the holy ones will be equipped "for the building up of the body of Christ." By our baptism, we have been given a responsibility to continue the building up of the kingdom of God on earth. This week reflect on your role in spreading the Gospel. Are there ways that your parish can help equip you for the mission that is yours? Consider joining a faith formation session or a Bible study group.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 13 Do Not Despair

As we begin this last week of Easter, allow Jesus' words in today's Gospel to echo in your heart: "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." It is easy to say not to be afraid, but that is part of human nature. If we truly trust in God, however, fear should not paralyze us. God is with us. Pray for the spirit to illuminate your heart and fill you with courage in your faith journey. Today's readings: Acts 19:1–8; Psalm 68:2–3ab, 4–5acd, 6–7ab; John 16:29–33.

Tuesday, May 14 Continuing the Ministry

"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends," Jesus tells his disciples in today's Gospel. The depth of God's love that is revealed in Jesus' suffering and death is a model for the love that Christ's followers should exhibit. Examine your sensitivity to the needs of others. Are you willing to reach out, or have you noticed that you are less sensitive to another's suffering? As we become bearers of the message of Christ, may we be living testimony for the world. Today's readings: Acts 1:15–17, 20–26; Psalm 113:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 7–8; John 15:9–17.

Wednesday, May 15 Beware of the Wolves

As Paul prepares the Church at Ephesus for his leaving, he warns the presbyters that wolves will come "to draw the disciples away." This concern that we hear in today's reading from Acts continues today. Wolves can come in the form of false messiahs or as distractions. Consider the attention that you give to obtaining the latest gadgets or fashionable apparel. Who or what distracts you from the life God has called you to? Pray to God to keep distractions from disturbing your focus. Today's readings: Acts 20:28–38; Psalm 68:29–30, 33–35a, 35bc–36ab; John 17:11b–19.

Thursday, May 16 Go to Rome

Jesus had shown the disciples that there would be consequences to following him. In Acts today, we read that Paul, who had persecuted Christians before his conversion, is being persecuted for his testimony. The imprisoned Paul does not protest when the Lord tells the disciple that he will continue to bear witness in Rome. Spreading the Gospel sometimes requires leaving our comfort zones. God might call us to unexpected people and places. Today's readings: Acts 22:30, 23:6–11; Psalm 16:1–2a, 5, 7–8, 9–10,11; John 17:20–26.

Friday, May 17 Do You Love Me?

Simon Peter is all of us. How many times have you sinned or walked away from God and returned truly sorry? In the hours before Jesus was crucified, Peter denied our Lord three times. Still, Jesus sought out Peter to ask, "Do you love me?" and to give him the responsibility to "feed my sheep." Can you imagine if Jesus asked if you love him? Do you understand that your baptism gives you a responsibility to spread his Word? Jesus forgives our sins and entrusts us with his mission. Today's readings: Acts 25:13b-21; Psalm 103:1-2, 11-12, 19-20ab; John 21:15-19.

Saturday, May 18 Keep Your Focus

The disciples were people like you and me with faults and gifts. They could become distracted with their vocation and inquire about what the future holds for another. When Peter asked about the disciple whom Jesus loved, our Lord replied, "What concern is it of yours? You follow me." In our parish communities, people can be distracted by what is not their concern. Take care to be attentive to your role and vocation. Today's readings: Acts 28:16–20, 30–31; Psalm 11:4, 5, 7; John 21:20–25.

Jamás solos

Lecturas del día: Hechos 1:1–11; Salmo 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9 (6); Efesios 1:17–23 o 4:1–3 o 4:1–7, 11–13; Marcos 16:15–20. En el último día de Jesús en la tierra, se supondría que los discípulos estuvieran tristes por una parte y, por otra, confundidos sobre lo que ocurrirá. Lejos de despejar esta confusión, Jesús lo que hace es enviarlos en misión. A la inquietud que tienen los discípulos sobre si Jesús restablecerá el reino de Israel, él responde: "No les toca a ustedes saber... serán testigos míos... hasta el confín del mundo". Empero, necesitaban ser arengados para entrar en acción por los ángeles que preguntan, "¿Qué hacen ahí mirando el cielo?".

El evangelio muestra a unos discípulos más seguros de sí mismos. "Vayan por todo el mundo proclamando la Buena Noticia", les dijo Jesús a los discípulos, así lo hicieron. En la lectura de Efesios, leímos que los santos serán equipados "para construir el cuerpo de Cristo". Mediante el bautismo, se nos ha conferido la responsabilidad de seguir la construcción del reino de Dios en la tierra. Esta semana reflexione sobre el papel que desempeña usted en la difusión del Evangelio. ¿De qué forma su parroquia podría ayudarlo a equiparse para la misión? Piense en ingresar a una sesión de formación de fe o a un grupo de estudio bíblico.

Lunes, 13 de mayo

No a la desesperación

En esta la última semana de Pascua, deje que las palabras de Jesús del evangelio de hoy hagan eco en usted: "En el mundo tendrán que sufrir; pero tengan valor: yo he vencido al mundo". Qué fácil decir "no tengan miedo"; es parte de la naturaleza humana. Empero, si de verdad confiamos en Dios, el temor no debe paralizarnos; Dios está con nosotros. Ore para que el Espíritu le ilumine el corazón y le infunda valor en su camino de fe. Lecturas del día: Hechos 19:1–8; Salmo 68:2–3ab, 4–5acd, 6–7ab; Juan 16:29–33.

Martes, 14 de mayo Seguir el ministerio

"Nadie tiene amor más grande que el que da la vida por los amigos", dice Jesús en el relato joánico de hoy. La dimensión del amor de Dios que se revela en el sufrimiento y la muerte de Jesús es modelo del amor que deben mostrar los seguidores de Cristo. ¿Cuán perceptible es a las necesidades ajenas? ¿Toma la iniciativa de acercarse a la persona que sufre? A medida que nos volvemos heraldos del mensaje de Cristo, seamos testigos verdaderos y testimonio vivo. Lecturas del día: Hechos 1:15–17, 20–26; Salmo 113:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 7–8; Juan 15:9–17.

Miércoles, 15 de mayo Cuidado con los lobos

Al preparar Pablo a la Iglesia de Éfeso para su partida, les advierte a los presbíteros que aparecerán lobos "para arrastrar tras de sí a los discípulos". Esta inquietud está presente todavía. Los lobos aparecen en forma de falsos mesías o distracciones. ¿Qué tanta atención usted le da a comprarse los últimos aparatos tecnológicos o el último grito de la moda? ¿Qué o quién lo distrae de la vida a la que Dios lo ha llamado? Ore a Dios para que mantenga a raya las cosas que lo desconcentren. Lecturas del día: Hechos 20:28–38; Salmo 68:29–30, 33–35a, 35bc–36ab; Juan 17:11b–19.

Jueves, 16 de mayo

Ir a Roma

Jesús había advertido a los discípulos de las consecuencias de seguirlo. Hoy en Hechos, Pablo, quien previo a convertirse perseguía a cristianos, es perseguido por dar testimonio de su fe. Encarcelado, no protesta cuando el Señor le dice que tendrá que dar testimonio en Roma como lo ha dado en Jerusalén. A veces difundir el Evangelio requiere dejar nuestra comodidad. Dios nos haría acudir a gente y a lugares inesperados. Lecturas del día: Hechos 22:30, 23:6–11; Salmo 16:1–2a, 5, 7–8, 9–10,11; Juan 17:20–26.

Viernes, 17 de mayo

¿Me quieres?

Todos somos Simón Pedro. Cuántas veces uno ha pecado o se ha distanciado de Dios, para luego volver arrepentido a él. Horas antes de que crucificaran a Jesús, Pedro lo negó tres veces. Aun así, le pregunta a Pedro, "¿Me quieres?", y le asigna apacentar "mis ovejas". ¿Se imagina si Jesús le preguntara si usted lo quiere? ¿Está consciente de que el bautismo le ha dado la responsabilidad de difundir la Palabra? Jesús perdona nuestros pecados y nos confía esta misión. Lecturas del día: Hechos 25:13b–21; Salmo 103:1–2, 11–12, 19–20ab: Juan 21:15–19.

Sábado, 18 de mayo

No hay que desconcentrarse

Los discípulos tenían defectos y virtudes como uno. También tuvieron que lidiar con los celos. Pedro pregunta a Jesús por el destino del discípulo predilecto, él responde, "¿A ti qué? Tú sígueme". En las parroquias nuestras, la gente podría andar de metiche. Enfóquese en su rol y vocación. Lecturas del día: Hechos 28:16–20, 30–31; Salmo 11:4, 5, 7; Juan 21:20–25.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?

A: Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding. and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

Q If we collect our goal of \$200, 000 before year's end, will we discontinue the Tarps Off Campaign?

A. No. The money collected this year is not assessed so we will continue the Tarps Off Capital Campaign. It is recommended that the parish has at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses.

Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?

A: The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

> Collected as of March 20, 2023 \$ 28, 611 Wall Cross Fundraiser \$ 19, 082 \$ 20, 690 Insurance Payment (for walls)

Q: What happened to that money collected?

A: That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

Q: If we add last year's roof fund (\$68, 383) to the current TAPRS OFF gross donations (expenses not taken out) as of 6 May 2024 (\$116, 682.63) How much do we have?

A: \$ 185,065. 63 YAY! (Gross Donations, net amount is less) Q: With that amount, can we start the work at least for the slope, flat roofs, roof top parapets, and roof

A. No. That part of the construction amounts to almost \$150, 000, 00 and less parish expenses, we are not there





him at meal before he ascended to heaven.

"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned. These signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." Mk 16: 15-18

When we lose someone close to us, we may often feel alone, scared at being without them for the rest of our lives, and even unsure how we are going to make it through each day after they are gone. These are natural human reactions. Jesus knows this. He gives the Apostles hope, letting them know that the things that he has done because he is God, they too will be able to do because God is still with them. Jesus said, "I will not leave you desolate" (John 14:18) and "I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Matt. 28:20). As St. Augustine points out, Jesus "did not leave heaven when he came down to us; nor did he withdraw from us when he went up again into heaven." sermon by Saint Augustine, bishop (Sermo de Ascensione Domini, Mai 98, 1-7: PLS 2, 429-495, Saint Augustine: No one has ever ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven (vatican.va)

What great news this is! It is not the confusion and loss which they experienced when Jesus died upon the Cross, but it is the joy of the Resurrection, the joy of knowing that Jesus is Ascending and that he is sending an Advocate, and that God is with them until the end of the age.

"Believe and be Baptized." It seems simple enough. In the Acts of the Apostles, Ch 8 we hear about the Ethiopian eunuch who hears the Word, but does not understand, and so St. Philip breaks open the Word to him. Now understanding, the Ethiopian requests to be Baptized to new life in Christ. He requests to be buried with Christ so that he can rise to new life in Him. The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1227 reminds us, "According to the Apostle Paul, the believer enters through Baptism into communion with Christ's death, is buried with him, and rises with him:

As Jesus commissioned the Apostles who were with Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. The baptized have "put on Christ." Through the Holy Spirit, Baptism is a bath that purifies, justifies, and sanctifies."

So we live as God's adopted sons and daughters. We live according to the Father's Will, through the Son, with the help of the Holy Spirit. We believe. The Holy Spirit teaches us in the ways of hope, faith, and charity.

In the prayer for the Act of Charity, often prayed with the Rosary, we pray, "O my God, I love Thee above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because Thou art all-good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for love of Thee. I forgive all who have injured me, and ask pardon of all whom I have injured. Amen."

Charity is about loving God with all our mind, our heart, and our soul. It is a way of life. Our modern culture often teaches that we can buy and sell things at whim. It teaches too that most things are relative and subjective. How many times have we heard the phrase 'There is wiggle room', or 'It's a grey area'? Love doesn't give us a choice. It comes from our inmost being surpassing all those things that the latest fads tell us are important.

In our belief in God, doesn't our heart turn to those who are in need? Love, compassion, and mercy well within us at the sign of a crying child, the sick, and those in need. An example is St. Damien de Veuster who knew that he would get leprosy if he went to minister to those who were sick in Molokai, yet the charity for the sick was so great that he took Christ to them and even when he was sick, continued to live the Gospels with his life, just like we are all called to

We each have our own vocations in life. We are called to be fathers, mothers, sisters, brothers, cousins, etc. We are called into professions like nursing, professors, powerplant workers, doctors, and some of us even deacons and priests. We are called to be rich, poor, middle class. We will be called to different things and to different places. As members of the Body of Christ, as Baptized persons, we witness the Good News by our lives through the love that we share by interacting with those who live and enter into our spheres of life. We love God first. Then we love others as God loves us. It can be challenging, but we are not left alone. As Jesus reminds at his Ascension, he will send us the Advocate. 'cuz we love, we give.

The following excerpts about St. Francisco Marto is borrowed from EWTN. Young Francisco was one of the three children at Fatima to whom the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared.

Alone among the three, Francisco never heard the Lady's words, although he saw her and felt her presence. After the first apparition, Lúcia conveyed the Lady's message to him, that he would go to heaven if he prayed many Rosaries. In the second apparition, Lúcia asked to be taken to heaven, and the Lady replied that Francisco and Jacinta would be taken soon, but Lúcia would have to wait for a time. She died February 13, 2005 at the age of 97...

After the apparitions ended, Francisco was enrolled in school but played truant as often as possible. He preferred to spend time praying to the "Hidden Jesus" in the Tabernacle. His great concern was to console His sorrowing Lord and the Heart of His Mother. When asked what he wanted to be when he grew up, Francisco answered, "I don't want to be anything. I want to die and go to heaven."

In August 1918, when World War I was nearing an end, Francisco and Jacinta both contracted influenza. They had short reprieves, but their decline was inevitable. In April of the following year, Francisco, knowing his time was short, asked to receive the Hidden Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion. The next morning, April 4th, at ten o'clock, he died with a glow on his shrunken face.

St. Francisco Marto is reported to have told others, "We must not commit even the smallest sin." and about the miracles, "We were burning in that light which is God and we were not consumed. What is God like? It is impossible to say, in fact, we will never be able to tell people." He loved the Hidden Jesus that he found when he went to Adoration.

As a Carmelite Sister, St. Lucia, one of the Fatimas visionaries spoke about the connection between Mary the mother of God and the Eucharist as taught to her by Mary herself and the Angel of Peace.

It is the body received from Mary, that in Christ becomes a victim offered up for the salvation of mankind; it is the blood received from Mary that circulates in Christ's veins and which pours out from his Divine Heart; it is this same body and this same blood, received from Mary, that are given to us, under the appearances of bread and wine, as our daily food, to strengthen within us the life of grace, and so continue in us, members of the Mystical Body of Christ, his redemptive work for the salvation of each and all to the extent to which each one clings to Christ and co-operates with Christ.

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
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
