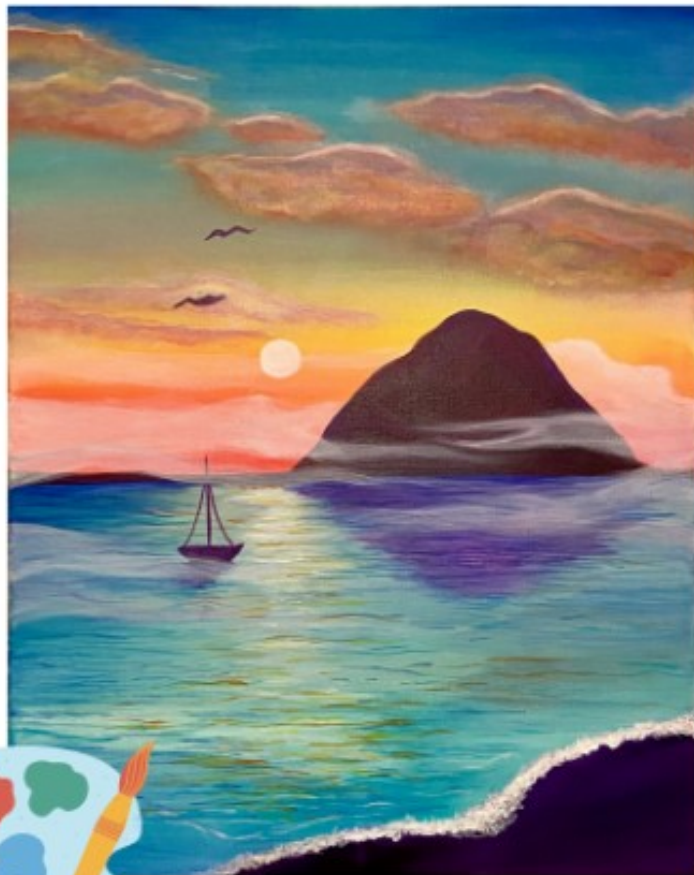

**Sunday, May 19, 2024**

**The Lord, the Giver of Life**



*Today's readings: Acts 2:1–11; Psalm 104:1, 24, 29–30, 31, 34; Galatians 5:16–25 or 1 Corinthians 12:3b–7, 12–13; John:19–23 or John 15:26–27, 16:12–15.* Today we rejoice in the sending of the Holy Spirit to the world. As proclaimed in the Gospel of John, Jesus had promised to send “the Advocate . . . the Spirit of truth.” When the Spirit arrived, Acts records, it was with a driving wind that filled the house where the disciples were and appeared as tongues of fire.

From that house, the disciples went into Jerusalem fearless as they preached the Gospel in numerous languages they had never before spoken. In the years that followed the descent of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were persecuted, arrested, and stoned. Still, they kept their hearts focused on bringing Christ to others.

Christians receive the Holy Spirit during the sacrament of baptism, as the celebrant prays that God bestows “new life” by “water and the Holy Spirit.” The Spirit will assist the baptized throughout life to fulfill their responsibility as “members of Christ, Priest, Prophet and King,” as the presider says in the anointing after baptism.

In your prayer life, be attentive to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and you, too, could be fearless in witnessing to the light of Christ in your life. As we recite in the Nicene Creed, the Holy Spirit is “the Lord, the giver of life.” When you open yourself to the Spirit, your life can be transformed. And just as the transformation of the disciples changed lives, so will your transformation.



## THIS WEEK AND BEYOND

**Monday, May 20**

### Mary, Mother of the Church

When Pope Francis decreed that the Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church, would be celebrated on the day after Pentecost, he reflected on the tradition of honoring Mary as both Mother of Christ and Mother of the Church. He also wrote of the opportunity for the memorial to draw the faithful to expand their perspective of the Church. The memorial, the decree states, “might encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety.” How would acquiring a maternal sense of the Church influence the ministry of those who are ordained? How would it influence the laity? *Today’s readings: Acts 1:12–14; Psalm 87:1–2, 3, 5, 6–7; John 19:25–34.*

**Friday, May 31**

### Visitation of the Blessed Virgin

Today, we remember two miracles. The first is Mary, pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit, and her older cousin Elizabeth, also pregnant in her old age. These women, and the sons carried in their wombs, had a mission to fulfill. Faith led Mary and Elizabeth to accept their mission. We, too, have a mission and purpose. As the month of Mary concludes, ask for Mary’s intercession to help you be true to your mission. *Today’s readings: Zephaniah 3:14–18a; Isaiah 12:2–3, 4bcd, 5–6; Luke 1:39–56.*

**Thursday, June 13**

### Memorial of St. Anthony of Padua

St. Anthony of Padua brought many hearts to God through his gift of evangelizing and knowledge of Scripture. He took seriously the words from Isaiah, “the spirit of the Lord God is upon me / because the Lord has anointed me. / He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the lowly, / to heal the broken-hearted.” At our baptism, we too were anointed and entrusted

with converting hearts and announcing the Good News. *Today’s readings: Isaiah 61:1–3d; Psalm 89:2–3, 4–5, 21–22, 25 and 27; Luke 10:1–9.*

**Monday, June 24**

### Nativity of St. John the Baptist

John allowed the Spirit to act through him. From his mother’s womb, he recognized the presence of the Lord. As John prepared the way for the messiah, he minimized himself to allow people to see Jesus. How do you prepare the way of the Lord? Do you seek attention or are you able to minimize yourself to allow the Spirit to work through you? *Today’s readings: Isaiah 49:1–6; Psalm 139:1b–3, 13–14ab, 14c–15; Acts 13:22–26; Luke 1:57–66, 80.*

**Saturday, June 29**

### Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul

Today we remember the lives of St. Peter and St. Paul. These apostles and martyrs are examples of obedience and resilience; they persevered in evangelization even when their lives were in jeopardy. Pray for Pope Francis and all who continue to spread the Good News, regardless of the challenges they face. *Today’s readings: Acts 3:1–10; Psalm 19:2–3, 4–5; Galatians 1:11–20; John 21:15–19.*

**Wednesday, August 28**

### Memorial of St. Augustine

On the Memorial of St. Augustine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, we might consider how open we are to continue our conversion and live as God calls us. After many years of a worldly life, Augustine was baptized when he was nearly thirty-three years old. In *The Confessions of St. Augustine*, he wrote of his conversion, “I have loved you too late. You were with me, but I was not with you.” Pray to St. Augustine to help you notice the presence of God and to grow in faith. *Today’s readings: 1 John 4:7–16; Psalm 119:9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14; Matthew 23:8–12.*

## Domingo, 19 de mayo de 2024 El Señor, el Dador de la vida



*Lecturas del día: Hechos 2:1–11; Salmo 104:1, 24, 29–30, 31, 34; Gálatas 5:16–25 o 1 Corintios 12:3b–7, 12–13; Juan 20:19–23 o Juan 15:26–27, 16:12–15.* Hoy nos regocijamos con el envío del Espíritu Santo al mundo. Como lo ha proclamado el relato joánico, Jesús había prometido al “Defensor”, al Espíritu de la verdad. Cuando el Espíritu arribó, según Hechos, lo hizo en una ráfaga de viento que llenó la casa donde se encontraban los discípulos y apareció como lenguas de fuego.

Desde esa casa, se dirigieron sin temor a los visitantes en Jerusalén predicando el Evangelio que era escuchado en múltiples lenguas. En los años posteriores al descenso del Espíritu Santo, los discípulos fueron perseguidos, arrestados

y lapidados. Y, sin embargo, no cesaron en su esfuerzo de llevar a Cristo a los demás.

Los cristianos reciben el Espíritu en el bautismo, cuando el celebrante ora para que Dios conceda “vida nueva” por medio del agua y el Espíritu. El Espíritu ayudará a los bautizados toda la vida a cumplir su responsabilidad como miembros de Cristo, sacerdote, profeta y rey, como dice el que preside en la unción después del bautismo.

En sus oraciones a lo largo de su vida, preste atención a la guía del Espíritu Santo; usted también podría sin temor atestiguar la luz de Cristo en su vida. Al rezar el Credo Niceno, el Espíritu Santo es el “Señor dador de vida”. Cuando uno se abre al Espíritu, la vida se transforma.



## ESTA SEMANA Y DESPUÉS

**Lunes, 20 de mayo**

### María, Madre de la Iglesia

Cuando el papa Francisco decretó que el día de la Bienaventurada Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia, se celebraría el día después de Pentecostés, reflexionó sobre la tradición de honrar a María en cuanto Madre de Cristo y en cuanto Madre de la Iglesia. También escribió de la oportunidad que representaba celebrar ese día a fin de atraer a los fieles y de ampliar sus perspectivas respecto a la Iglesia. Celebrar esta memoria, señala el decreto, “puede incrementar el sentido materno de la Iglesia en los pastores, en los religiosos y en los fieles, así como en la genuina piedad mariana”. ¿Cómo influiría en el ministerio de los que se ordenan el que logran tener un sentido maternal de la Iglesia? ¿Cómo influiría sobre los laicos? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 1:12-14; Salmo 87:1-2, 3, 5, 6-7; Juan 19:25-34.*

**Viernes, 31 de mayo**

### Visitación de la Bienaventurada Virgen María

Hoy celebramos dos milagros: el embarazo de María por obra del Espíritu Santo y el de su prima Isabel que concibió a una edad avanzada. Estas mujeres y los hijos que llevan en el vientre tienen una misión que cumplir. La fe lleva a María e Isabel a aceptar esta misión. También nosotros tenemos una misión y un propósito. Al concluir el mes de María, pida a María que interceda para ayudarle a ser fiel en la misión. *Lecturas del día: Sofonías 3:14-18a; Isaías 12: 2-3, 4bcd, 5-6; Lucas 1:39-56.*

**Jueves, 13 de junio**

### Memoria de san Antonio de Padua

Gracias a su don de evangelización y conocimiento de las Sagradas Escrituras, san Antonio de Padua acercó a muchos corazones a Dios. Tomó muy a pecho estas palabras de Isaías: “El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque el Señor

me ha unguido. Me ha enviado para dar una buena noticia a los que sufren, para vendar los corazones desgarrados”. Al ser bautizados también nos ungen y nos envían a convertir corazones y anunciar la Buena Noticia. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 61:1-3d; Salmo 89:2-3, 4-5, 21-22, 25 y 27; Lucas 10:1-9.*

**Lunes, 24 de junio**

### Natividad de san Juan Bautista

Juan dejó que el Espíritu actuara a través de él. Cuando estaba en el vientre de su madre, reconoció la presencia del Señor. Le abrió el camino al Mesías al minimizarse él mismo para que la gente viera a Jesús. ¿Usted cómo le abrirá el camino al Señor? ¿Busca atención o puede minimizarse a fin de que el Espíritu obre a través de usted? *Lecturas del día: Isaías 49:1-6; Salmo 139:1b-3, 13-14ab, 14c-15; Hechos 13:22-26; Lucas 1:57-66, 80.*

**Sábado, 29 de junio**

### Santos Pedro y Pablo, Apóstoles

Hoy recordamos las vidas de san Pedro y de san Pablo. Estos dos apóstoles y mártires son ejemplo de obediencia y resiliencia; continuaron la evangelización incluso a riesgo de perder la vida. Ore por el papa Francisco y por todos los que siguen compartiendo la Buena Noticia, sin importar los retos. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 3:1-10; Salmo 19:2-3, 4-5; Gálatas 1:11-20; Juan 21:15-19.*

### San Agustín

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

**Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?**

**A:** Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we were told to prepare. Our goal is \$200, 000. We are hoping that it will cover the cost of 'surprises' when the roof is lifted off. There is a possibility that it will cost more.

**Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?**

**A:** Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

**Q: Is S.E.A.S. a nonprofit?**

**A:** Yes! St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is a church and is a 501 (c)(3). Donations are tax deductible.

**Q: Do you accept stocks?**

**A:** Yes. We can accept stocks and bonds as donation.

**Q: Can I ask my employer to be a matching donor?**

**A:** Yes. Often businesses are willing to match their employee contributions to different causes.

**Q: May I give a small amount now, and more later?**

**A:** Absolutely! Your direct donations are being recorded for tax purposes. Your accrued total donations determine the tier for which you will be recognized.

**Q: Is the TARPS OFF! Capital Campaign still accepting pledged?**

**A:** Yes. Pledges are still being accepted. Pledges can be indicated on the donation envelopes by marking whether it will be a one time donation or that it is a pledge and for how many years it will be for as well as how much per month. Secured online donations through our provider, Vanco, can be established for pledges through our parish website. For digital bulletin readers, the hyperlink is below. Simply click on the blue or copy and paste it into your internet browser.

**Q: If I don't want to use the envelope, can I give a donation online?**

**A:** Yes. You can use our parish website using the above hyperlink or you can use the main web page to navigate to the TARPS OFF! Capital Campaign page of our website.

**Q: Are donors using the Angel Tiers?**

**A:** Yes. Several parishioners have marked their donations and circled or written the angel tier they desire.

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

**Q: If we collect our goal of \$200, 000 before year's end, will we discontinue the Tarps Off Campaign?**

**A:** No. The money collected this year is not assessed so we will continue the Tarps Off Capital Campaign. It is recommended that the parish has at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses.

**Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?**

**A:** The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

\$ 28, 611	Collected as of March 20, 2023
\$ 19, 082	Wall Cross Fundraiser
\$ 20, 690	Insurance Payment (for walls)

**Q: What happened to that money collected?**

**A:** Some of that money is still set aside for the roof replacement. It was shared with the parish in our 2023 Income and Expense Report (available on our parish website) that in 2023 we had a deficit of \$ 18,675. 46 and that amount of the \$68, 383 had to be used for parish operations. The adjusted 2023 roof amount is **\$ 49, 707.54**

**Q: If we add last year's adjusted roof fund (\$49,707.54) to the current TAPRS OFF gross donations (2024 fundraising expenses not taken out) as of 12 May 2024 (\$117, 577.63) How much do we have?**

**A:** \$ 167,0285 17 YAY! (Gross Donations only, net amount is less and will be available once reports are generated)

**Q: With that amount, can we start the work at least for the slope, flat roofs, roof top parapets, and roof drains?**

**A:** No. That part of the construction amounts to almost \$150, 000. 00 and less parish expenses, we are not there.

With dipping plate collects some of the collected roof monies have been needed for operations cost, as happened last year and reported recently by Fr. Joey, and which we may be faced with again this May and throughout the summer, months that our parish is normally financially hurting as parishioners vacation.

**Q: It seems like we are doing well with the donations & creative fundraisers. We may not need a loan. What do you think?**

**A:** It depends. We still have the TARPS OFF creative fundraisers lined up:

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At Pentecost we celebrate the birthday of the Church. In the Acts 2:1-11 narrative, the Holy Spirit came in the form of a driving wind and tongues of fire upon the Apostles, some women, and Mary, the mother of Jesus, giving them the gift of tongues and the gift to proclaim. They did. They proclaimed Christ Jesus with their lives and their words. They witnessed Christ. They, like we, serve God and each other: *Serving is Eucharist in action.*

In the National Eucharistic Revival Prayer, we pray:  
*Jesus living in the Eucharist, come and live in me.*  
*Jesus healing in the Eucharist, come and heal me.*  
*Jesus sacrificing yourself in the Eucharist, come suffer in me.*  
*Jesus rising in the Eucharist, come and rise to new life in me.*  
*Jesus loving in the Eucharist, come and love in me.*

We ask Christ to live in us. In Galatians 2:20 we hear, *"I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me."* Through our Baptism in Christ our lives do not belong to us, but to Christ. When we do things, we do it for Christ. When we waste our time, we waste Christ's time. When we show love and compassion, we do it for Christ and give it to Christ. As a wise Catholic woman once said from her death bed, "Life is about serving others."

We ask Jesus to come heal us. Jesus came to heal the whole person: mind, body, and soul. No one can avoid suffering, hurt, pain, or physical death. With Original Sin, sin wounded the world when it entered the world, just as soul of humankind carries the burden of Original Sin. Sin is our separation from God, a rupture in our relationship. Sin also separates us from each other. The Hebrew word for sin is *'hhatah'* which means 'to miss the mark,' according to Ancient Hebrew Resource Center ([www.ancient-hebrew.org/definition/sin.htm](http://www.ancient-hebrew.org/definition/sin.htm)) *Hhatah* is described as like someone who is walking a path and deliberately chooses to create their own way. Throughout the Old Testament and New Testament God continuously gives us His prophets and Christ himself who show us the Way, a right direction. In the Sacrament of Confession, we, humbly and with contrite hearts, ask Jesus to forgive our Sins and bring us back to that state of grace that he longs for us so that we can be in Communion with Him, walking the journey together. In hope we also ask Jesus not just for our spiritual healing, but for our physical and mental healing inspired by Scripture, e.g., Jn 5:8-9 where Jesus says to the man who had

not walked for thirty-eight years, *"Rise, take up your mat, and walk."* *Immediately the man became well, took up his mat, and walked."* Jesus reminded us that to be healed, we need faith. We are asking Jesus for help with that when we ask for healing. He gives us the Advocate, the Holy Ghost or Holy Spirit, who came to Christ's followers at Pentecost and pours out His gifts upon us at our Baptism and in full at Confirmation. In our darkest moments we have the Holy Ghost, which is to say, God, to rely upon when our humanity fails us. God heals. *"He forgives all our sins, and He heals all our diseases."* Ps 103: 3 Lest we doubt, we need but look at that scab on our body where once we were cut and know that even though there was once a wound, it is being healed, just like we are mind, body, and soul through God's love. We ourselves become wounded healers through Christ by serving others in need of healing. Christ is the Divine Healer, we are his hands, feet, ears, shoulders, and mouth.

We ask Jesus to come suffer in us. When we think of Jesus suffering, what comes to mind? Is it the night in the Garden at Gethsemane? Is it is scourging at the pillar? Is it carrying the cross? Is it his crucifixion? Christ suffered and died for us so that through his Resurrection we too are raised to new life. "For as Christ's sufferings overflow to us, so through Christ does our encouragement also overflow." 1 Cor 5. Encouraged by Christ, we bring our sufferings to the foot of the Cross, to lay them down as an offering. There our burdens and sufferings are sanctified and made holy because they are added to His and his shared yoke makes our burden light. Mt 11: 28-30 Christ is our Hope, the Light of the World.

We ask Jesus to come and rise to new life in us. We are a people of life. Through our Baptisms we die to sin and are born to life in Christ. Through his Cross and Resurrection, we are raised to life everlasting. "Amen, amen, I say to you, the hour is coming and is now here when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. For just as the Father has life in himself, so also, he gave to his Son the possession of life in himself." Jn 5:25-26 We live our lives the best we can by allowing Christ to live in us so encouraged by Christ, we can rise to new life in Christ.

We ask Jesus to come and live in us. We are asking God to be reconfigure our hearts into his image. We embrace his command to love. We imitate Christ to become Christ because we let him live in us. We love and serve because that is Eucharist in action. 'coz we love, we give.



In the living Body of Christ, the Church, as Saint Paul says in (1 Cor 12: 27-31), there are teachers and Prophets and healers. But in the Body of Christ there are also those who, as Jesus says of Nathaniel in the Gospel, are without guile. It is important to remember that in the flesh, when he walked in Israel, Christ, the incarnation of God among us, embraced and walked with the wounded and the sick and those who were counted as nothing. I would want to add to the list of those who are part of the body of Christ the many people with special needs, especially many whose whole life is filled with suffering from physical realities: some who are not even able to communicate their pain or speak: the true “voiceless”

It is important to recognize that they are a vital part of the Body of Christ, especially because they mirror the suffering and trauma and poverty that Christ knew. They are privileged mirrors of that love of God, that love that, as Saint Paul says at the end of that passage, is the greatest gift of all...

I was having breakfast in the Monastery with a group of people who had come from one of our Parishes in Chicago. They shared the story from their Parish of a young man with Downs Syndrome who loved to be the Cross bearer at Mass. He would sit in the sanctuary and looking all over: up at the ceiling and all around. After Mass, his mother would always ask him what he was looking at? And he would always ask her: “don’t you see Jesus and all the angels and saints?” His mother thought it was his simple-minded faith. Later, at Mass that day here in the Church I was sitting in the back, and it was Father Tom Nguyen’s first time as a deacon preaching here at St. Bonaventure’s. Suzie Gavin, a dear friend was here, along with her son Jimmy, who has suffered his whole life from Angelman Syndrome, the lack of a chromosome which causes him constant seizures, and has kept him from ever really speaking, even though he recognizes people and is very affectionate. He’s now 43 years old, and Suzie and Jim Gavin love him and care for him 24 hours a day. That day Jimmy was having a hard time, and Suzie wanted to listen to the homily. She was rolling him in his wheelchair to keep him moving because when he moves it seems to help him calm down. But Suzie was getting uncomfortable because Jimmy was groaning out loud. I told Suzie to follow me, and I took her through the back door of Church, through the Monastery, to our Chapel behind the altar, and sat her in the seat that Father Solanus would sit in when the Friars would pray. I continued to roll Jimmy around the back-Chapel while we listened to Mass over the loudspeaker. But at the time of consecration, I wanted to be present, so I wheeled Jimmy to the door of the back Chapel from where we could see the Priest-Celebrant. At the moment the consecrated Bread was raised, Jimmy lifted himself from his wheelchair with his arms outstretched, and as soon as the host was placed on the altar, he sat back down. And when the chalice with the sacred blood of Christ was raised, he once again raised himself from his wheelchair chair with his arms stretched out. I was flabbergasted. I realized that Jimmy was seeing the same thing as the simple, innocent young man in Chicago with Downs Syndrome would see. Jesus appears to the simple of heart, the humblest. He is present to those who are innocent of heart. And it is truly Jesus who was present. I’m convinced that Jimmy sees him.

## HOSPITALITY HAPPENINGS

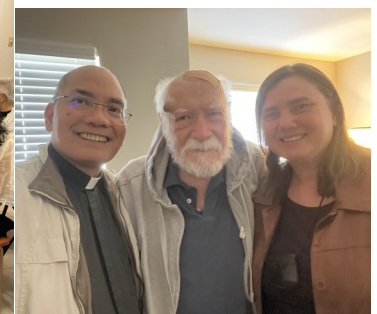
